

So you need service hours and you aren't sure what to do....

There are several ways for students to earn volunteer hours. Here are a few examples:

1. Volunteer at a nursing home or hospital
2. Volunteer at an animal hospital
3. Volunteers needed at SRC Animal Shelter. Contact Lauren at (850) 981-8876.
4. Work at soup kitchen feeding the homeless such as Loaves and Fishes
5. If you are in ROTC, BETA, NHS, ANCHOR, these clubs do a lot of community service hours. They will need to document the service hours on a form and have sponsor sign off.

You must turn in your hours to your Guidance counselor.

6. Beach Clean ups
7. Habitat for Humanity
8. Summer camp volunteer
9. Volunteer yard work or any other type cleaning
10. Hurricane clean up, repairs after a storm or general repairs.
10. Pensacola Big Fair (October) takes volunteers each year and offers no less than (30) \$1,000 scholarships every year.

Bright Future's rules (not Pace High's rules)

*Students cannot volunteer for parents, cannot count singing in the choir at church, or playing an instrument in the orchestra at church.

There are a lot of possibilities. Once a student has earned 75 hours, we recommend they submit the hours to guidance. The Bright Futures Full Academic Scholarship requires 100 hours. Students have until graduation day to submit their service hours to count for Bright Futures.

Don't forget to turn your service hours into your Guidance Counselor so they are included on your transcript!
